B. <u>Executive Officer's Report (Cassingham)</u>

1) Proposed MERA 2016 Special Parcel Tax Bond Financing Documents

Cassingham summarized her report noting Next Gen Project financing options have been under review since the passage of Measure A in November 2014. Sperry Capital fine-tuned options for Finance Committee recommendation to the Governing Board. On February 24, the Governing Board directed the preparation of the bond documents for presentation at today's meeting to capture historically low-interest rates for the betterment of the Project. Bonds in the principal amount not to exceed \$33M, combined with parcel taxes collected to date through construction, will fund the estimated \$40M Project cost.

Cassingham presented Resolution 2016-04 to be acted on which approves the Indenture of Trust, Financing Agreement between MERA and the County, Notice of Sale of Bonds, Official Statement and Continuing Disclosure Agreement in substantial form. Some final tweaks and tables will be added and she expects the documents to be finalized by week's end. She noted bonds will be sold by competitive sale. The Resolution authorizes the President, Vice President and Executive Officer to execute and deliver the documents.

Cassingham complimented the Financing Team beginning with Gafffney, Sperry Capital and Bond and Disclosure Counsels for turning the documents around so quickly. She noted the many iterations they have gone through. She gave special thanks to Eilerman for all his help in finalizing the Financing Agreement with the County which is another important security for the bonds with the rating agencies in assuring the flow of the funds. She asked him to convey appreciation to Sheila Lichtblau and Roy Given as well. Cassingham thanked Ortiz for all her oversight and help. Gibbs and Cassingham concluded that we are ready to get this done.

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M/S/P Roach/Kelly approve Resolution No. 2016-04 and all related documents thereto and authorize the MERA President, Vice President and Executive Officer, with the concurrence of MERA General Counsel to finalize and execute same.

Before the vote, Gaffney noted this Resolution authorizes the sale of bonds at 10 a.m. on April 19, which needs to be authorized by the Executive Officer to accept bids within 2 hours. In response to Gaffney, Gibbs noted interest rates are still looking terrific although up .25% since we began working on the financing.

2) Report No 13 from Next Gen Project Oversight Committee – NGPOC (Jeffries)

Jeffries noted the only key thing happening since his last report was the issuance of the draft RFP, which was distributed on March 2 to the Executive Board, Project Oversight Committee, Ops Group and MERA and DPW staff. Comments were received from 16 people. At the NGPOC meeting prior to this meeting, the comments were reviewed and issues arising from the comments were discussed. Staff will meet on March 29 to fine-tune the comments for submission to Federal Engineering.



3) Other Information Items

Cassingham reminded those who had not yet filed their Form 700s of the March 25 hard copy filing deadline and April 1 e-filing deadline.

C. Operations Reports (Echols)

Echols noted Nelson and Chuck's long hours of effort in reviewing the RFP before it was distributed to the various groups. They held a Workshop for the Operations Working Group to help them focus their detailed review which followed. Pearce added that many commitments were made to the member agencies that are being held to in the RFP.
