- B. Executive Officer's Report (Morris-Mayorga)
 - 1. Report No 88 on Next Gen System Project

Dave Jeffries reviewed this report as included in the packet, noting that the draft revised construction schedule is continuing to be discussed to provide information needed for updating the budget summary/cash flow analysis. There was discussion on Coyote Peak and the expense of this site in particular along with timing which may be scheduled sooner. President Pearce reminded the Board that Mr. Jeffries is the Public Information Officer (PIO) and media inquiries should be directed to him. Ms. Morris-Mayorga stated that once the construction schedule and budget update are completed this will be brought to the Board, in October if possible. Mr. Jeffries responded to inquiry on delays citing the reason is due to the impact of design firm change, receipt of documents, and correction of prior firm errors; designs are being confirmed prior to issuing additional bid packages.

2. Contract Change Order for Tiburon Site – Fidato

This item is being postponed to next month's meeting.

3. Other Information Items

Legal Counsel, Trisha Ortiz, provided an update on the passage of AB 361 allowing agencies to meet under relaxed circumstances, Zoom/virtual meetings. MERA meets the requirements of this due to the Marin County Health Officer's measures recommending social distancing. A resolution will be brought to the Governing Board at the October meeting to make the necessary findings to comply with the act and declare that it is necessary to meet remotely.

C. Operations Reports (LeBlanc)

1. Proposed First Amendment to the Emergency Communications System Maintenance Agreement Between the Marin Emergency Radio Authority (MERA) and the County of Marin

Andrew LeBlanc presented this item as provided in the packet and responded affirmatively to the inquiry on whether the County has the available resources to perform the necessary work. There was discussion on revising the amendment language to state this is on a per project basis in the event there are additional sites in need of this work. Mr. LeBlanc clarified that in the event road maintenance would exceed \$10,000, it would be brought back to the Governing Board with a quote on the total cost for approval.
